Description

Green-4-Future is an innovative project that addresses the need to align economic goals with environmental and climate goals. The Green-4-Future project provides those in Academia, Business Development Organisations, Entrepreneurship, Policy Making, with a wide range of educational resources to support their endeavors in the Green Economy of the future.



Throughout the course of the Green-4-Future project, project partners from Germany, Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Greece, Ireland, Portugal and Romania are working with VET trainers, Training and Development Officers, Entrepreneurs and Potential Entrepreneurs to develop their skills in order to reconcile their economic goals with environmental and climate goals. In the Green-4-Future framework, a wide range of learning materials have been created to achieve this main goal. In addition to the creation of a Green EntreComp Framework, the Green-4-Future project will concentrate on a training scheme to prepare and support adult educators in their understanding of business modelling for companies in the circular economy.



Throughout the course of the Green-4-Future project, partners will work with and train VET tutors to develop their own resources and skills which they can use to further encourage the reconciliation of economic goals with environmental and climate goals.

All this learning content is systematized in a MOOC (Massive Open Online Courseware) accessible via an online platform, where VET tutors, Learning and Development Officers, Academics, and entrepreneurs can access all of the learning materials developed in the Green-4-Future project.
